Using Guyana as a case study, this talk will identify the social and legal issues that hinder an accurate assessment and response to the problem of human trafficking for sex work in the context of a growing mining industry. It will also focus on the basic features of human trafficking in Guyana, offer critical policy-based responses and suggest appropriate methods for limiting the problem and assisting victims.
