Using gendered geographies of power as a frame, this paper presents the experiences of Indian students across three space-time locations: before the students left India; while abroad in Toronto; and their return to New Delhi. The discussion, through the narratives of students and their parents (in India), uncovers the gendered power relations in and across geographic and social scales that shape the decision to go abroad, the experience while abroad and the experience of return 'home'.

Gunjan Sondhi is a postdoctoral fellow at the York Centre for Asian Research (YCAR), working on a project entitled 'International Student and Education Migrant Mobilities', funded by Population Change and Lifecourse Knowledge Cluster and YCAR. Gunjan received her PhD from the Sussex Centre for Migration Research (SCMR) at the University of Sussex, UK. Her doctoral research examined the gendered experiences of Indian International students in Toronto..
